

Fig. 7.17 Health expenditure by provider, 2017 (data OECD 2019)





Fig. 7.18 Hospital expenditure by type of service, 2017 (data OECD 2019)



EU and Cybersecurity

- Scientific advice is an essential support to inform the Commission concerning all the range of risks we are now facing, including cyberattacks
- Cyberattacks are no more ransomware or malware, but "killerware": patients are in danger!
